After that, fold the bottom part up on both sides.

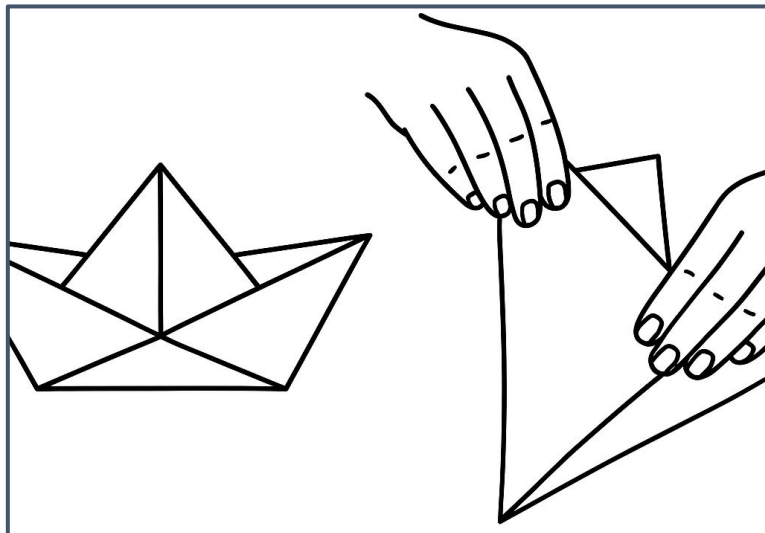
Then, open the shape again and pull the sides to make a square.
